


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INTRODUCTION

This affordable rental housing guide is produced as a public service by the jurisdictions in the Tri-Valley area, including the cities of Dublin, Livermore, Pleasanton, San Ramon, and the Town of Danville. This guide provides:



- A listing, by area, of affordable below-market rental units (also known as BMR's).
- A listing of housing-related services in the Tri-Valley area.
- Information regarding emergency housing, fair housing and other resources available to Tri-Valley residents.

Keep in mind...

Below-market apartments are in high demand.

It may require persistence and time to find a complex that is affordable to your needs. You may need to make several calls and research other affordable housing opportunities such as the websites that are provided throughout this guide. There may be wait lists for housing and/or housing-related services.

Not all affordable housing services are provided in all locations.

Some emergency housing resources are located outside of the Tri-Valley area but are available to Tri-Valley residents. In all cases, these listings are provided for information only and are not an endorsement by Tri-Valley member jurisdictions. Information provided may be subject to change.

Decide where you would like to live and search in those areas first.

Use this chart to determine the complexes that fit your income category and offer services suitable to your needs (i.e. senior housing, accessibility, etc.).



HOW TO DETERMINE YOUR INCOME CATEGORY



DETERMINE YOUR HOUSEHOLD SIZE

Include all members regardless of age who will be living with you.



CALCULATE HOUSEHOLD INCOME

Add up the monthly gross* income for all household members 18 years and older, then multiply by 12. This gives you your annual household income.

(*Gross income is the amount you receive prior to any deductions. Income includes earnings from but not limited to: employment, government benefits, interest income, retirement income, child support, etc.)



DETERMINE INCOME CATEGORY

Without going over amounts, use the income eligibility chart on the next page to determine which income category/AMI % your household fits into.

Please note:

Final determination of income will be determined by each complex. The above recommendations are guidelines only.

RENTAL HOUSING CHART DEFINITIONS

Below are a list of definitions to help you better understand the Rental Housing Chart on pages 7-19.

Income Limits

Income limits are established by law for admission into low to moderate income housing projects or to qualify for rent supplemental assistance. Percentages are based on the most recent Area Median Income (AMI) for Alameda and Contra Costa counties. Current income limits are listed on page 5.

BMR Units

A Below-Market-Rate (BMR) unit is an apartment that is priced to be affordable to households that are low to moderate income.

62+ Years

Housing that is restricted to seniors at least 62 years of age unless otherwise noted. Assisted living and nursing care are not included in these facilities unless otherwise noted.

Accessible Units

These are units that are fully accessible by wheelchair and incorporate specific features for persons with mobility impairments.

Accepts Section 8

Section 8 is a federal rental assistance program. This applies to the BMR units only. The acceptance of Section 8 vouchers is at the option of the individual owner or landlord and is subject to change. Interested persons should call to confirm the acceptance of Section 8 at each complex.



PROGRAMS & RESOURCES



RENTAL ASSISTANCE

SECTION 8

The Section 8 program provides monthly rental assistance to low-income households. The Section 8 program is highly competitive and the waiting list to obtain a voucher can be very lengthy and isn't open very often. Approved tenants pay a fixed percentage (approximately 30 percent) of their income directly to their landlord for housing costs. The local Public Housing Authority pays the remainder.

Section 8 has two types of vouchers:

1) Housing Choice Voucher – issued to tenant and may be used in any unit where landlord will accept.

2) Project Based Voucher – is for use only in a specific property/unit. It “stays” with the property and can not be used in another other property.

Housing Secure exists to help prevent displacement by providing emergency financial assistance to low-income tenants. A one-time grant is available for tenants facing imminent risk of losing their home and who are experiencing an event that made them temporarily unable to pay their housing costs.

Rental Assistance Program (RAP)

Assists in helping tenants experiencing a temporary financial setback and their landlords, to create a repayment schedule for expenses such as outstanding rent or move-in costs. ECHO offers participating landlords a guarantee of repayment. Available to families with children, elderly, permanently disabled, emancipated foster youth, veterans, victims of domestic violence, or a pregnant woman in 2nd trimester or later.

Project Share

Helps formulate housemate agreements between home seekers and home providers. Some participants provide services in exchange for full or partial rent. Special arrangements can be made to meet the needs and preferences of all parties.

CRIL's Housing Coordinator will teach you how to look for appropriate housing, identify resources that can support independent living, negotiate with your landlord, understand tenant rights and responsibilities, learn how to improve your credit report and how to identify possible resources for a security deposit. CRIL keeps a current list of local rentals. CRIL does not own housing or run its own residential facility.

Frequently Asked Questions

FAQ's



How do I know if I qualify for an affordable unit?

You may qualify if you have a gross income that falls within the applicable income guidelines of the housing you are applying for. Some apartments for example, serve households who are 50% of the Area Median Income (AMI) or below. In order to determine your AMI income category, follow the instructions on page 3-5 of this guide. Once you know your income category you can use the rental housing chart on pages 7-19 to search for complexes that offer housing in your income category. Also, keep in mind, the acceptance criteria is at the sole discretion of the property owner and other determining factors such as, credit and background are also considered.

What types of housing are available at each complex?

The rental housing chart on pages 7-19 checks off the types of housing available at each complex. The check marks will show if the property for example, is 62+yrs only, if it accepts Section 8, or has accessible units. The chart also tells you how many BMR units each site has.

What is the amount of rent?

The amount of rent for each complex will vary based on the location, household income and the bedroom size of each unit. To find out the current rent amount for each complex, call or visit the apartment's website. Some jurisdictions may also post the maximum rent limits on their websites.

Why are the waitlists so long?

Because of the high demand of affordable housing, and comparatively low supply, it is not rare to be on a waiting list for several years. Often the waitlists are closed and rarely open up for people to apply. Try to get on as many waitlists as you can, and monitor when a waitlist might open up. Some properties and jurisdictions offer an interest list that will notify you when waitlists open up. Visit each city's website or the property's website, to find out more about their interest lists.

Frequently Asked Questions

FAQ's



What is the difference between Section 8 rentals and below market rate units?

Section 8 is funded by the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and administered by cities and counties through local housing authorities. The resident only pays 30% of their income toward their rent. There is a lengthy process to apply for Section 8 (see pg. 20).

Below Market Rate units are available through developers who build affordable housing properties. There are maximum income limit requirements for these units. The rent is capped at a maximum amount that is affordable to those who are low to moderate income based on the area's median income (AMI). Tenants are required to income qualify each year.

What is the difference between Assisted Living and Independent Living Facilities?

Assisted Living facilities provide nurses, meals, and/or housekeeping as needed. Independent living is similar to assisted living, though seniors don't require daily care and assistance. Residents within an independent living community are typically able to perform everyday tasks

What is a Residential Care (AKA board and care) Facility?

More than 90% of the residential care homes are licensed for six or fewer residents housed in a private residential home setting. The residential care system was established to provide non institutional home based services to dependent care groups such as the elderly, developmentally disabled, mentally disordered and child care centers under the supervision of the Department of Public Social Services.
