

# Alviso Adobe Community Park Virtual Tour

Use this guide for a few ideas about how to explore the park virtually.

## FEELING ARTSY



The Alviso Adobe was built in 1854. Alviso was a Californio. He looked after his uncle's cattle herds and was the mayordomo, the ranch head for José Dolores Pacheco before he purchased a slice of the Rancho Santa Rita in 1851.

**DRAW** what you imagine the Alviso Adobe was like when Francisco Alviso built it in 1854. Sketch what you think the Alviso Adobe was like before changes were made like the chimney, the roof, glass windows, and beams.



## HISTORY PLEASE



Sharing stories about your culture and practicing traditions that have been a part of your ancestor's life is very important in many peoples' cultures, including the Ohlone.



Maria De Los Angeles Colos and Jose Guzman, principal Chochenyo language informants. Both of these individuals shared their culture, their language with anthropologist John Peabody Harrington. Harrington interviewed both Maria and Jose in the 1920s. Thanks to them, Ohlone people today are reviving, learning, and teaching others the Chochenyo language.



## VISITOR GUIDE 101



Don't rush through your virtual journey. Practice **SLOW LOOKING**. Take your time with the objects in the virtual exhibits.

- Enter a room or space and select one object to observe.
- Spend at least one 1 minute observing. Try not to talk or identify the object by name.
- Practice, 'I Notice, I Wonder, It Reminds me of'
  - I Notice: Describe what you are seeing, look at shape, size, color, what do you think it feels like?
  - I Wonder: What do you want to know about this object?
  - It Reminds me of: What does this item remind you of? Have you seen something like this before? What do you find familiar about the object?
